After completing Mastery I, attendees will be eligible to earn the [Qualified Dentist Designation](#). The Mastery Program also offers a new pathway for dentists to achieve the [American Board of Dental Sleep Medicine](#) (ABDSM) Diplomate status. Individuals who complete all three Mastery sessions will be eligible to sit for the ABDSM certification examination. ABDSM Diplomate status has long been the gold standard of dental sleep medicine, and this new program can help dentists fulfill the necessary requirements to achieve this designation.

“Being an ABDSM Diplomate is a prestigious status that requires a commitment to continuing education as well as dedication to our field. We encourage all dentists who want to provide oral appliance therapy to get the requisite training through the Mastery Program and become ABDSM Diplomates.” said AADSM President Harold A.
